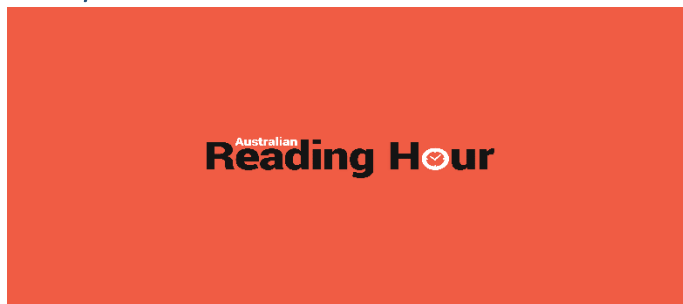

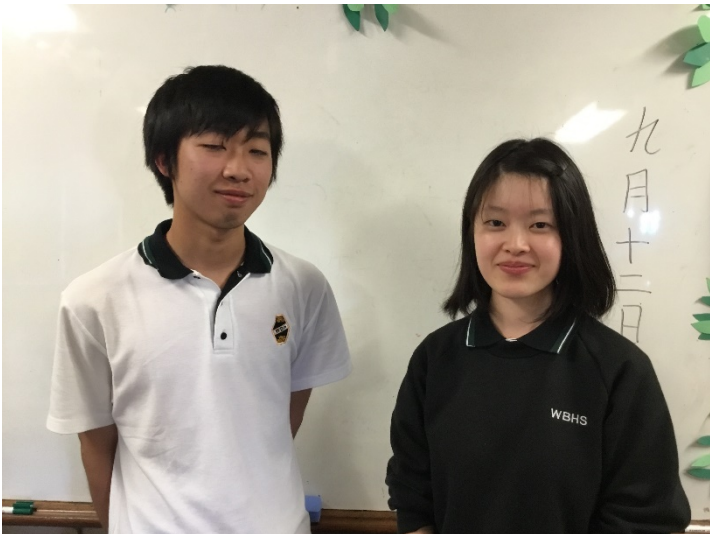
## Maker Project

Our two Hakodate students showing WBHS how to cook Japanese Oyakudonburi.



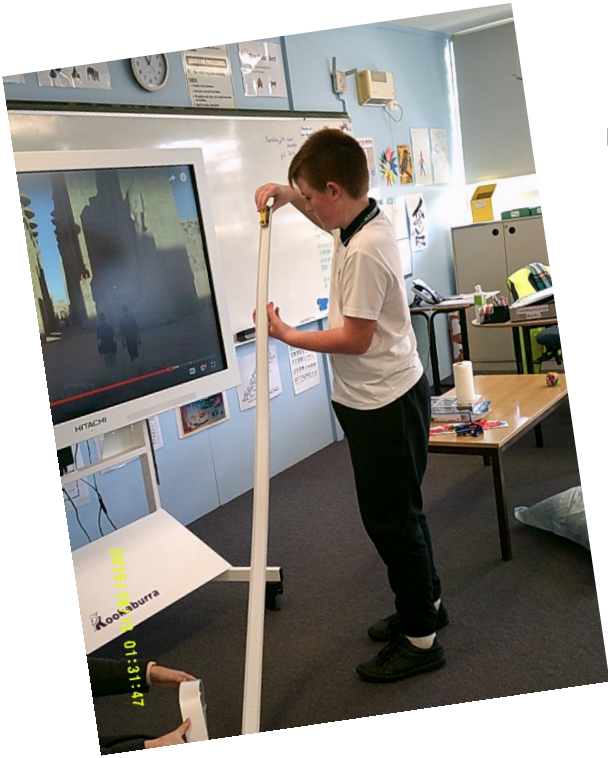


The Australians have a go at cooking. Ready to serve food! Year 10 had a great time fostering international relationships over a yummy meal.

### Special Education News

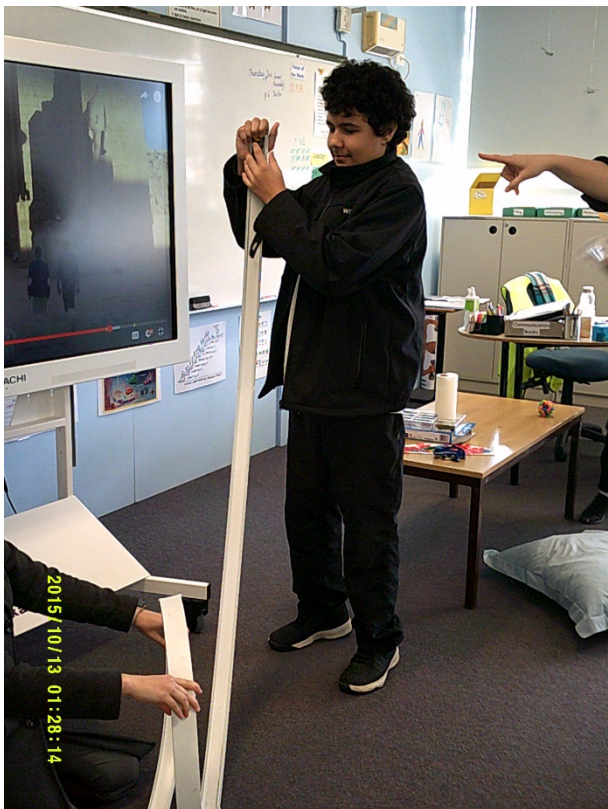
