

Principal's Message

As we move quickly into the last few weeks of the school year I hope, on reflection, our families are happy with what the school has offered in terms of academic, sporting and cultural programs this year. We have all worked hard to provide our students with the best opportunities to achieve their personal best. The school executive are in the process of compiling our achievements for the year for the "Achievements" booklet which will be posted or emailed to all families early in Term 1 2013. It is certainly a very busy time finalising student reports, the budget, planning and staffing for 2013. Our school enrolments continue to grow steadily with an anticipated enrolment of 1376 in 2013. We are at capacity in all the junior year groups with only a small number of spaces available in the senior school. Unfortunately I have needed to decline requests for non local placement in Years 7 – 10, to ensure our local placement students have a space should new families move into the area.

This year we have continued to work towards improving the aesthetics of the playground and classrooms for students. In the Christmas vacation the ovals will be aerated, re-seeded and fertilised to make a safer playing surface for students. We will be installing irrigation to the top and bottom ovals and planting shade trees to make the area better for our lessons and for fun during recess and lunch. Ten classrooms will be painted and/or

re-carpeted in the vacation as well. Whilst we have an old infrastructure in our school, we do work hard to keep the gardens and the rooms looking nice so that students can feel proud of their school.

Already a few snippets of exciting news have come through in relation to the HSC results. Congratulations to **Samuel Maher, Alexis Walker and Bronte Whittington**, whose Bodies of Works have been pre-selected into Artexpress. Their art works entitled respectively "Imagin", "Abandoned" and "Five Beaches" are being considered for Artexpress as we speak. Fingers crossed for three in Artexpress!

Congratulations also to **Breanna Walter** whose musical performance has been selected for possible inclusion in Encore.

Congratulations as well to **Dylan Mitchell** whose Major Design Project for Industrial Technology has been nominated for inclusion in InTech 2013, the annual exhibition of outstanding Major Design Projects developed by 2012 HSC Industrial Technology students. This is very exciting as it heralds some very strong HSC results again this year. We receive the results in mid December and I'm sure there will be fantastic results to share and celebrate.

On the sporting side congratulations to **Erin Moore (10), Georgie Picker (9) and Amelia Stocker (7)** whose team recently came third in the Open Synchronised Ice

Skating Division at the NSW Ice Skating Championships in Canterbury, qualifying them for the Australia National Ice Skating Championships to be held in Brisbane in early December. Good luck girls.

Please continue to pass on to me any student achievements that have occurred out of the school so that I can share this news with our school community through this Bulletin.

In conclusion, another swift but successful year. It's hard to believe we are in the last few weeks of the school year. Time flies when you are having fun!

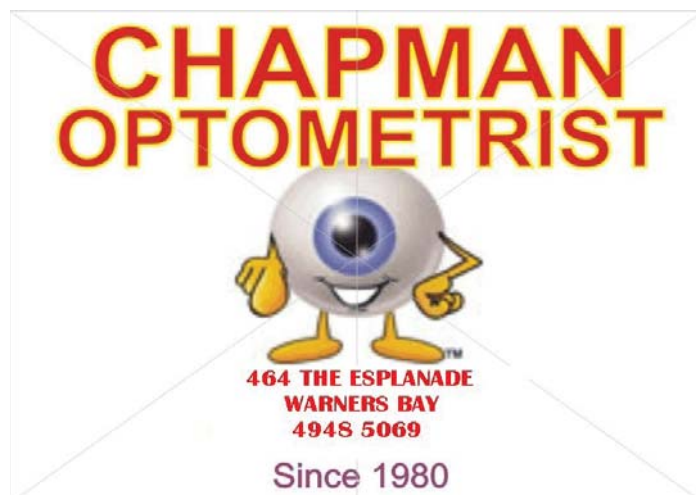

WBHS PRINCIPAL'S READING CHALLENGE!

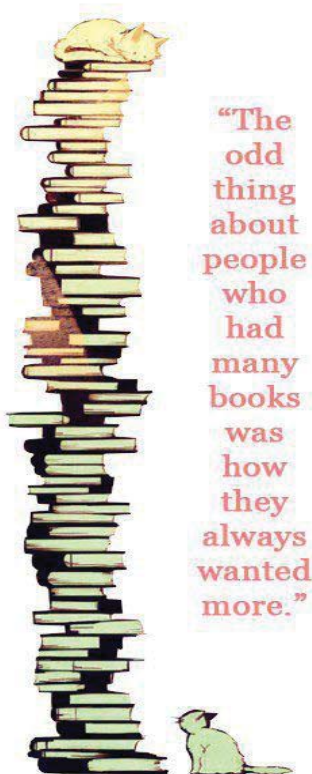

GAME TRAINING WORKSHOP A ROARING SUCCESS!

Forty budding game developers attended the much anticipated Game Training Roadshow on 22 November which was organised and hosted by the Computing staff of the TAS faculty. It was a wonderful opportunity for students to learn to create their own video games. The session was run by industry expert, Jeff Ayling of GameTraining.

Students learnt how to create their own commercial grade 3D World with hills, ocean, sky and trees which blow in the wind. They also learnt how to import vehicles to make a fun driving game, write simple artificial intelligence code and character animation code as well as the 12 most important coding concepts needed to create games for all major platforms, mobile devices and games consoles.

Students received links to the free commercial grade development software, access to a library of game development resources and online video tutorials to use at home (valued at over \$3500). These resources included vehicle packs, 3D models, scripts, terrain tools, an amazing weather simulator and a fully scripted ten level physics game.

EXCITING NEW INNOVATION

Our success and the enjoyment of the One Day Tournament above has spurred the idea of running a Speed Chess Tournament at school in our Library.

- **Practice matches** were played during Week 7, Monday 19 to Thursday, 22 November. Anyone can come on any day to see how they like it this week.

- **Actual comp** will be played in Week 8: Monday, 26 November, and runs each lunch time that week till Thursday, 29 November.
- **For the comp**, two matches will be played each lunch-time, so eight matches will be played by each player. Players need to be in the Library ready to play the first match at 1.35pm.
- **Format:** This tournament is an eight round 'Swiss' competition. This means that all players play eight games and no-one is 'knocked out' of the tournament.
- **Time Limit:** each player has maximum five minutes of moves for each match. Chess clocks will be used in this tournament. You need to attend at least one practice session in Week 7 to see how the comp works, and get used to using the chess clocks. If a **player gets to zero time, they lose that match.**
- **The winner is the player on most points after the eight rounds.**

We hope to have lots of students enter this fun comp, especially those who may not have entered the "more formal" Chess Championships competitions run previously. Come along and see how you like it!

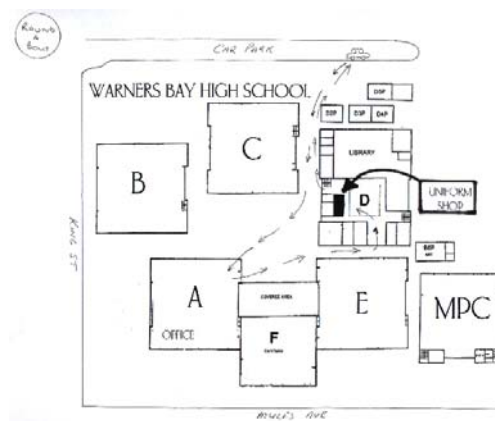
